

Future Looks Bright with Longmont Students



The adage that children are the future was proven true during two spectacular events held in Longmont last month.

During the first-ever Longmont Hackathon, a 14-year-old middle school student won the \$1,500 first prize in the best civic app category by creating a computer program that will pull calendar information from various local websites into a single location. The app provides a convenient one-stop site to see event information from all across the city.

Several other high school students and a few adults also participated and created rich and meaningful work during the marathon hacking weekend. Their ideas included a total redesign of the City’s website and a bike map that can be accessed through a smartphone.

The second event, for high school students, encouraged teens to get more involved in local government by addressing and debating real life community issues such as fracking, marijuana legislation and urban renewal at the mall.

Called “Democracy Days,” the event was held at the Longmont Civic Center and hosted

by several city council members and designed by teachers at the St. Vrain Valley School District. Just like their techie friends who spent a weekend developing computer apps to enhance the civic experience, these young adults analyzed issues and created solutions to everyday problems.

Both events lifted these students out of the classroom and challenged them in real-life scenarios.

As a former engineer who worked in a high tech industry, I can’t help but be impressed by the abilities of these young students. Whether in the area of technology or in political science, the quality of education being offered in Longmont is a quantum leap from my days in school, and it gives me great confidence to know that Longmont students will be molding the future of our community and possibly the world.

All of us in Longmont can be proud of these intelligent and motivated students.

Play it Safe: Call Before You Dig

Like many folks you probably have a list of summer projects. Our City utility departments ask you to add one item to the top of that list: request a free utility line locate for areas that are near work areas.

Before you lay sod, plant a tree or dig a new flower bed, call the Utility Notification Center of Colorado by dialing 811. Within two days, color-coded flags or paint will be placed within the work area to indicate the presence of utility lines. This will prevent an accident that can result in injury, service interruptions, and possible fines or liability expense under Colorado law.

Longmont Museum to feature LEGO exhibition

This summer's special exhibition at the Longmont Museum will be built one brick at a time.

Opening June 8 and running through September 8, ***BUILD! The Amazing World of LEGO***, features the work of artists from across the country and LEGO enthusiasts from Colorado and Wyoming. The exhibition is being created in collaboration with the Colorado-Wyoming LEGO Users Group, whose creations also have appeared at Denver Comic-Con and the History Colorado Center. Additional LEGO constructs will come from artists across the U.S.

But this exhibit isn't just about looking at LEGO constructions. As the title implies, it's about building with LEGOs. LEGO fans of all ages will be able to create and race a LEGO car, build and play with furniture in LEGO-scale houses, create buildings in a LEGO town, and build a LEGO bridge.

Today, regular meetings of more than 15 clubs and nearly 250 special events are scheduled at the Callahan House every year.
