

# City Council Resolution Urges Your Support of Storm Drainage Bonds



In the June election Longmont residents will be asked to vote on Ballot Question 2A, which asks if the City should issue revenue bonds to fund repairs and improvements to the city's storm drainage system.

The Longmont City Council recently passed a resolution in support of this ballot question. I encourage you to read the resolution reprinted below as well as the supplemental information you will receive in the mail. And most important, I urge you to vote by mail before June 24.

## RESOLUTION R-2014-39

A RESOLUTION OF THE LONGMONT CITY COUNCIL URGING LONGMONT CITIZENS TO VOTE "YES" ON BALLOT QUESTION 2A, ISSUING BONDS PAYABLE FROM THE CITY'S STORM DRAINAGE ENTERPRISE REVENUES TO FINANCE SYSTEM WIDE STORM DRAINAGE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO ST. VRAIN CREEK DRAINAGE IMPROVEMENTS, ON THE JUNE 24, 2014 SPECIAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION BALLOT

WHEREAS, the September 2013 flood caused severe damage to the City's storm drainage system; and

WHEREAS, the issuance of storm drainage revenue bonds will enable the City to construct the first phase of critical flood mitigation measures along St. Vrain Creek, including channel restoration from west of Hover Road to Martin Street without raising taxes; and

WHEREAS, the issuance of storm drainage revenue bonds in 2007 paid for the Left Hand Creek Flood Control Project and the Lykins Gulch Project that helped protect life and property during the 2013 flood; and

WHEREAS, the planned stream channel modifications and infrastructure upgrades along St. Vrain Creek will help protect Longmont from future 100-year flood flows, just as the previous projects along Left Hand Creek and Lykins Gulch helped to minimize damage in the 2013 flood; and

WHEREAS, storm drainage capital projects are critically important to the health, safety and welfare of Longmont residents.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LONGMONT, COLORADO, RESOLVES:

### Section 1

For the reasons stated above, the Longmont City Council supports ballot question 2A.

### Section 2

The City Council urges Longmont citizens fully to inform themselves about ballot question 2A before voting.

### Section 3

The City Council urges Longmont citizens to vote "YES" on ballot question 2A regarding issuing bonds payable from the City's Storm Drainage Enterprise revenues to finance future systemwide flood mitigation projects, including but not limited to, St. Vrain Creek drainage improvements.

## Play it Safe: Call Before You Dig

Before you lay sod, plant a tree or dig a new flower bed, call the Utility Notification Center of Colorado by dialing 811.

Within two business days, color-coded flags or paint will be placed within the work area to indicate the presence of utility lines. This will prevent an accident that can result in injury, service interruptions, and possible fines or liability expense under Colorado law.

**At least 48 hours before you plan to dig, call 811 (Utility Notification Center) AND 303-774-4884 (City of Longmont locating service)** to request utility line locates.

## City Observes Memorial Day

Longmont city government observes Memorial Day on Monday, May 26, as a holiday. Most City facilities will be closed, and trash and recycling collection will be one day late that week.

## Enjoy your garage sale! Just be sure to follow the rules

Yard and garage sales are a great way to clean out your house and make a little extra money. But there are City ordinances that govern how often you can hold a sale and how you can advertise it.



City of Longmont Municipal Code 6.44.090 states that it is unlawful to hold a garage sale for a period of more than three consecutive days or for more than

12 days total in any 12-month period.

It also is unlawful to post a sign advertising your sale (or anything else, for that matter) on any telephone or electric pole or other public property or on any private property without the owner's consent (municipal code 9.24.010)

If you don't follow these simple rules you can be issued a warning notice or receive a summons for the violation.

## Stay cool at the pool


Longmont's outdoor pools open in late May for summer fun for the whole family.
