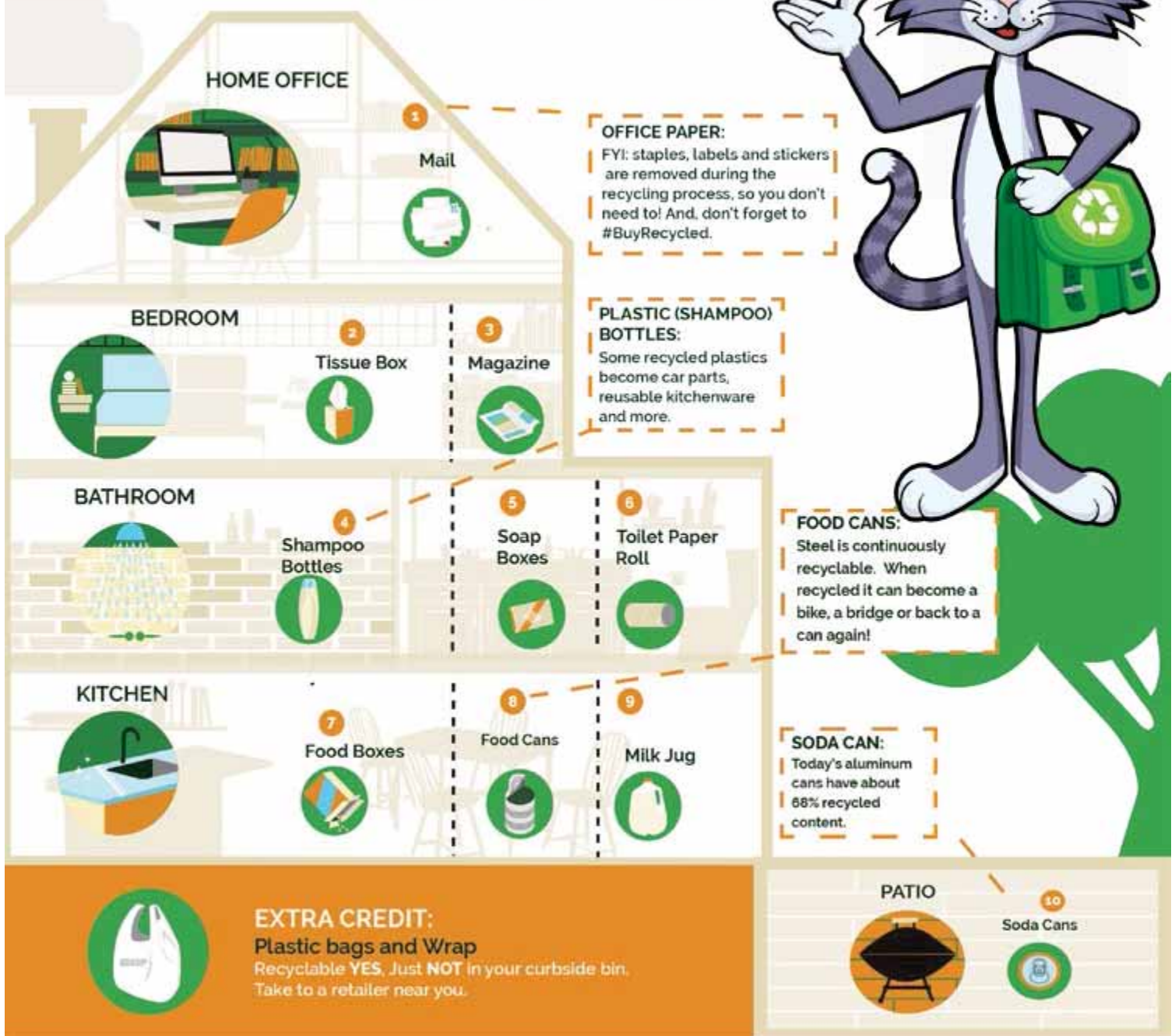

COLORADO WATER
LIVE LIKE YOU LOVE IT



1 Don't RUN OFF

Only apply as much water as the soil can absorb. Use the Cycle and Soak method—break watering times into 3 short cycles, allowing an hour of soak time in between.



2 Program your sprinkler

By programming your automatic sprinkler system to fit the weather conditions, you water when the plants need it, not by the clock.



3 Right time you'rE watering

Water during the cooler hours and avoid sprinkling on windy days.



4 Be weather smart

If it has rained in the past few days, or will rain soon, don't water.



5 Plant the right plants

Choose Plant Select® and X-rated plants that thrive in Rocky Mountain gardens.



6 Don't water the sidewalk

Don't water the sidewalk, rocks or road. They won't grow.



7 Aerate

Aerate in the spring or fall to open up soil to absorb more moisture.



8 Sweep

Don't waste water by spraying off a driveway or sidewalk, use a broom instead.



9 Install smart sprinklers

Use efficient technology like drip irrigation, rotary spray nozzles, and smart irrigation controllers.



10 Check for leaks

Check sprinkler systems and timing devices to be sure they are operating properly.



11 Raise your blade

Cut grass at least three inches in height to encourage deeper roots and better moisture retention. Never cut more than 1/3 of the grass blade.



12 Avoid over-fertilizing

The application of fertilizers increases the need for water. Apply fertilizers that contain slow-release, water-insoluble forms of nitrogen.



13 Mulch

Mulch to retain moisture in the soil. Mulching also helps to control weeds that compete with plants for water.



14 Xeriscape

Xeriscape is based on a combination of seven common sense principles to save water while creating lush, beautiful landscapes.

**ARE YOU TAKING CARE
OF OUR WATER?**

Well-kept gardens and yards beautify our neighborhoods and improve property values. Here's how you can maintain them in a way that helps keep our environment and water clean and healthy!

Grass clippings, leaves, fertilizer, pesticides and other pollutants from your yard can end up on driveways, sidewalks, streets and gutters where they can be washed into a storm drain by rain, snowmelt, or water from sprinklers. Storm drains carry these pollutants directly to our creeks and waterways without treatment, which can harm aquatic life and affect downstream uses.

By following these tips, you are helping create a more sustainable Longmont.

CREATING A SUSTAINABLE LONGMONT

> Avoid over-watering, which can carry pollutants from your lawn, sidewalk and driveway into the storm sewer. Adjusting sprinklers so that you're not watering the street, sidewalk or driveway also helps conserve water.



> Sweep or blow grass clippings back onto the lawn or vegetated areas or dispose of them as compost or trash. Don't leave them on the street, sidewalk, driveway or gutter. Compost or recycle leaves and other yard waste.



> If you use a lawn or pest control service, ask them about their environmental options and certifications and make sure they follow these and other best management practices that will protect human health and the environment.

> Do not apply fertilizers, pesticides or herbicides to areas where they can be washed into the gutter or storm sewer by rain or sprinklers, or when moderate to heavy rain or wind is forecast. Use pesticides, herbicides and fertilizers sparingly and according to directions. Using the wrong chemicals can damage plants or kill beneficial bugs and animals.

> Avoid using combination fertilizer/weed killer products.

Hand pick weeds when possible, and if you must use chemicals, spot apply treatments only where they are needed. Do not apply chemicals to bare soil or impervious surfaces such as sidewalks, driveways or streets.
