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**ITEM 1. CALL TO ORDER**

- Robert J. Frick, the Local Licensing Authority (the Authority) called the hearing to order at 1:56 pm.

**ITEM 2. LLA APPROVAL REQUIRED**

- 2019 LLA Annual Report

- The Authority approved the proceedings listed above.

**ITEM 3. APPLICATIONS APPROVED ADMINISTRATIVELY**

- The Secretary advised the Authority that there were no applications administratively approved.

**ITEM 4. PUBLIC INVITED TO BE HEARD**

- The Authority invited the public to be heard. No one from the public appeared to speak.

**ITEM 5. APPLICATION FOR LICENSE RENEWAL – RECENT VIOLATION**

Licensee: Seven Liquors Inc. d.b.a. Seven Liquors

Premises: 1668 Main Street

Owner: Sang Kim

Action Required: Approve or deny.

- Sang Kim, owner appeared before the Authority regarding the renewal application and the recent liquor violation that was issued by the State of Colorado on 2-2-19. The Authority questioned the Licensee about what practices and policies have changed since the violation. The Licensee discussed the increased training since the violation. The Licensee advised the Authority, that the employee who caused the violation was retained. She is receiving extra training and wants to keep working. This is her last chance.

The Authority approved the renewal application of the liquor license with a stern warning.

**ITEM 6. APPLICATION FOR LICENSE RENEWAL – RECENT VIOLATION  
APPLICATION FOR TASTING PERMIT RENEWAL – RECENT VIOLATION**

Licensee: Twin Peaks Liquors Inc. d.b.a. Twin Peaks Liquor

Premises: 999 S. Hover St., #1

Manager: Eric Larson

Action Required: Approve or deny.

- Eric Larson, manager appeared before the Authority regarding the renewal application and the recent liquor violation that was issued by the City of Longmont on 1-8-19. The Authority questioned the Licensee about what practices and policies have changed since the violation. The Licensee discussed the additional TIPS training and additional supervision that has been put in place since the violation. The Licensee advised the Authority, that the tastings events go well on Fridays but not so well for Saturdays.

The Authority approved the renewal application of the liquor license and the tasting permit application.

**ITEM 7. PUBLIC HEARING FOR A TRANSFER OF OWNERSHIP**

Licensee: Everyday Stores, LLC d.b.a. Everyday 5723

Premises: 900 Ken Pratt Blvd.

Owner: Harbans S. Lali

Action Required: Approve contingent upon final inspections by Building and Fire, or deny.

- Harban Lali, owner appeared and testified before the Authority. He explained his experience with owning and operating other convenience stores that sells beer. He explained their corporate policies for verifying age prior to sale. He explained they require liquor server training prior to employment. He discussed their point of sale technology and rules for all sales. Every card must be scanned, everyone's age is verified. The Authority opened the public hearing on this item and there was no one present to speak regarding the application from the public. The Authority closed the public hearing.

The Authority approved the application for a transfer of ownership.

**ITEM 8. PUBLIC HEARING FOR A NEW BREW PUB LICENSE**

Licensee: Risky Wibby, LLC d.b.a. Wibby Brewing

Premises: 209 Emery St.

Owner/president: Ryan Wibby

Action Required: Approve pending surrender of the State wholesale and manufacturing licenses.

- Robert Runco, lawyer spoke on behalf of licensee, regarding the conversion of the license from a State wholesaler and manufacturer license to retail brew pub license. Robert provided the LLA Secretary their Affidavit for Surrender of State Liquor License form, signed and dated. Ryan Wibby, owner and president, appeared and testified before the Authority. He provided testimony about his experience in the brewing industry. He confirmed that he nor his business has never been issued a liquor violation. He discussed the business strategy and corporate structure and policies in place. He explained why they are requesting to convert their license to a retail brew pub license. He discussed control of the licensed premises, including how they separate the brewing section from patrons. He discussed service of alcohol and procedures for verifying age prior to service. Explained the GoTab technology being used. All employees are TIPS certified. The petitioning process was discussed and what their results were to demonstrate needs and desire. Assistant City Attorney, Tim Hole was present for hearing, and had no comments or concerns. The Authority opened the public hearing on this item and there was no one present to speak regarding the application from the public. The Authority closed the public hearing.

The Authority approved the application for the new retail brew pub licenses contingent on the surrender of the two State licenses (wholesale and manufacturer).

**ITEM 9. NEW BUSINESS FROM LLA SECRETARY**


