2. **Adoption of February 13, 2020 minutes** – no changes. Cindy moves, John seconds. Approved unanimously.
3. **Additions/Corrections to March 12, 2020 Agenda** – none

5. **Public Art Projects Updates**
 - A. Collyer Park project status—Angela Project has moved forward for finalization. Step one of three is complete. Project should hopefully be complete in another two months.
 - B. 9th and Alpine—Noah Project is under contract with original artist. Artist is working on redesign.
6. **Presentation** – Traffic and Pedestrian Data Analysis by Colorado University AIPP intern, Alexis Newton
 - A. Traffic data shows works in the Public Art collection in Longmont receive 366.8 thousand views a day total, including Downtown 156.2 thousand views a day.
 - B. Shock Art 434.4 thousand views a day.
 - C. This data collected is only vehicle data and does not include pedestrian, bicycle or other methods of transportation and viewing.

 - A. Direct Purchase Ursa Major—Randi We are in contact with 5th and Main location for Ursa Major. Trying to lock down a timeline for securing the location.
